News: Chinese vessels maintain presence in East China Sea near disputed Senkaku islands for record 158 days

What's in the news?

• Japan protested Beijing after four armed Chinese coastguard vessels entered the waters of the Senkaku island, which Tokyo considers its territory.

Key takeaways:

• China's Coast Guard ships have been in the waters surrounding Japanese-controlled islands in the East China Sea for a record 158 days, breaking the previous record established in 2021.

Senkaku Islands:

- The Diaoyu/Senkaku Islands are a group of uninhabited islands located in the East China Sea.
- They are known as Diaoyu in China and Senkaku in Japan.
- The sovereignty over these islands is disputed between Japan, China, and Taiwan.



Senkaku Island Dispute:

The Senkaku Islands dispute, or Diaoyu Islands dispute, is a territorial dispute over a group of uninhabited islands known as:

- the Senkaku Islands in Japan,
- the Diaoyu Islands in China, and
- the Tiaoyutai Islands in Taiwan.

Both Japan and China claim ownership of these islands.

Basis of the Dispute between Japan and China:

- The dispute primarily stems from conflicting national claims to sovereignty over the islands. Japan has administered the islands since 1972, following the U.S. returning administrative rights to Japan after World War II.
- However, China and Taiwan claim historical ties to the islands dating back several centuries.

Concers of the Dispute:

- The dispute has led to increased military activity in the East China Sea, raising concerns about potential conflicts.
- It also affects broader relations between China and Japan, influencing trade, diplomacy, and regional security dynamics.

Senkaku Dispute and U.S.:

- The United States, officially does not take a position on the sovereignty of the islands but recognizes the administrative control by Japan.
- The U.S. has stated that the islands are covered under the U.S.-Japan Security Treaty, implying that any attack on the islands would prompt a response under this treaty.

Present Administration:

- They were never administered by any other country before Japan incorporated them into its territory in 1895.
- Currently, Japan administers and controls the Senkaku islands as part of the city of Ishigaki in Okinawa Prefecture.

Go back to basics:

Location of Senkaku Island:

• The Senkaku Islands are located in the East China Sea between Japan, China, and Taiwan.

Geography:

• The Senkaku chain comprises **five islets** – Uotsuri Island, Kuba Island, Taisho Island, Kitakojima Island, and Minamikojima Island – and three rocks – Tobise Island, Okinokitaiwa Island, and Okinominamiiwa Island



Strategic Significance of Location of Senkaku Island:

• The islands are close to strategically **important shipping lanes**, offer **rich fishing grounds**, and are thought to contain **oil deposits**.
