
INDIA – SLOVENIA RELATIONS

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

- **Defence and Agriculture**: The dialogue acknowledged potential cooperation in niche defence manufacturing and agricultural innovations, including smart farming, agroprocessing, and food sustainability.
- **Migration, Mobility, and Cultural Exchanges**: Both sides expressed interest in promoting people-to-people ties by facilitating easier mobility of professionals, students, and tourists, as well as encouraging cultural diplomacy through exchanges, festivals, and academic collaborations.
