NEWS: Centre, UNICEF to provide career counselling for Eklavya tribal school students

WHAT'S IN THE NEWS?

TALASH, launched by NESTS in collaboration with UNICEF India, is a national programme aimed at enhancing the aptitude, life skills, and self-esteem of tribal students in EMRSs through psychometric assessments, career counselling, and digital teacher training. It aligns with NEP 2020 to promote inclusive, holistic, and future-ready tribal education.

Context

- The National Education Society for Tribal Students (NESTS), in collaboration with UNICEF India, launched TALASH (Tribal Aptitude, Life Skills and Self-Esteem Hub).
- This is a **national initiative** aimed at the **holistic development** of tribal students enrolled in **Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRSs)**.

About the TALASH Initiative

1. Meaning and Scope

- TALASH stands for **Tribal Aptitude**, **Life Skills and Self-Esteem Hub**.
- It is a pioneering programme that combines psychometric testing, career counselling, and life skill training for tribal youth.
- The initiative is aimed at over 1.38 lakh tribal students across 28 States and 8 Union Territories.

2. Vision and Objectives

- Help tribal students develop **self-awareness**, **confidence**, **and clarity** about their career paths.
- Promote personal growth, resilience, and emotional well-being.
- Aligns with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, which emphasizes holistic, inclusive, and learner-centered education.

Key Components of TALASH

1. Psychometric Assessments

- Based on NCERT's 'Tamanna' initiative (Try and Measure Aptitude and Natural Abilities).
- Helps identify a student's interests, strengths, and cognitive preferences.
- Generates Career Cards that provide customised career suggestions and learning pathways.

2. Career Counselling

- Offers **one-on-one and group guidance sessions** to students.
- Helps align their educational goals with career aspirations.
- Informs them about **diverse career options** including higher education, vocational training, and entrepreneurship.

3. Life Skills and Self-Esteem Modules

- Focuses on social-emotional learning (SEL), including:
 - Communication
 - Problem-solving
 - Conflict resolution
 - Emotional regulation
- Enhances **self-worth, confidence, and psychological resilience** among tribal students.

4. E-Learning for Educators

- A dedicated digital portal is developed to train EMRS teachers.
- Includes mentoring modules, interactive resources, and best practice guides.
- Enables teachers to become academic mentors and emotional guides.

Implementation Strategy

- The initiative is being **rolled out in phases**, beginning with select cities and EMRS clusters.
- So far, 189 teachers from 75 EMRSs have been trained for initial implementation.
- Target: Full-scale deployment in all EMRSs across India by end of 2025.

Significance of TALASH

- First-of-its-kind national programme exclusively for tribal students.
- Leverages technology and data-driven tools to ensure effectiveness even in remote areas.
- Addresses the long-standing tribal education gap by ensuring career guidance, emotional support, and skill development.
- Fosters inclusive, equitable, and future-ready education in line with NEP 2020 goals.

Complementary Initiatives and Strategic Partnerships

1. Exam Coaching and Career Support

• MoU with Ex-Navodayan Foundation:

- Provides coaching for **IIT-JEE**, **NEET**, and other competitive exams.
- Builds on the success of **600+ EMRS students** who have cleared national exams.

MoU with Tata Motors:

- Offers **vocational training, apprenticeships**, and **employment support** for EMRS graduates.
- Helps bridge the gap between classroom learning and workplace readiness.

2. Educator Empowerment

- A centralised e-learning platform enables teacher training and knowledge sharing.
- Teachers become **facilitators of social-emotional development** in addition to academic learning.

Adi Karmyogi Programme – A Parallel Initiative

- Launched by the **Ministry of Tribal Affairs**, separate from TALASH.
- Aims to build a cadre of field-level tribal officers with citizen-focused delivery orientation.
- Target: Capacity-building for 20 lakh tribal stakeholders.
- Implementation Structure:
 - 180 State-level Master Trainers
 - 3,000+ District Trainers
 - 15,000+ Block Trainers

- Established: 2019 under the Ministry of Tribal Affairs.
- Mandate: Operates and manages Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRSs) across India.
